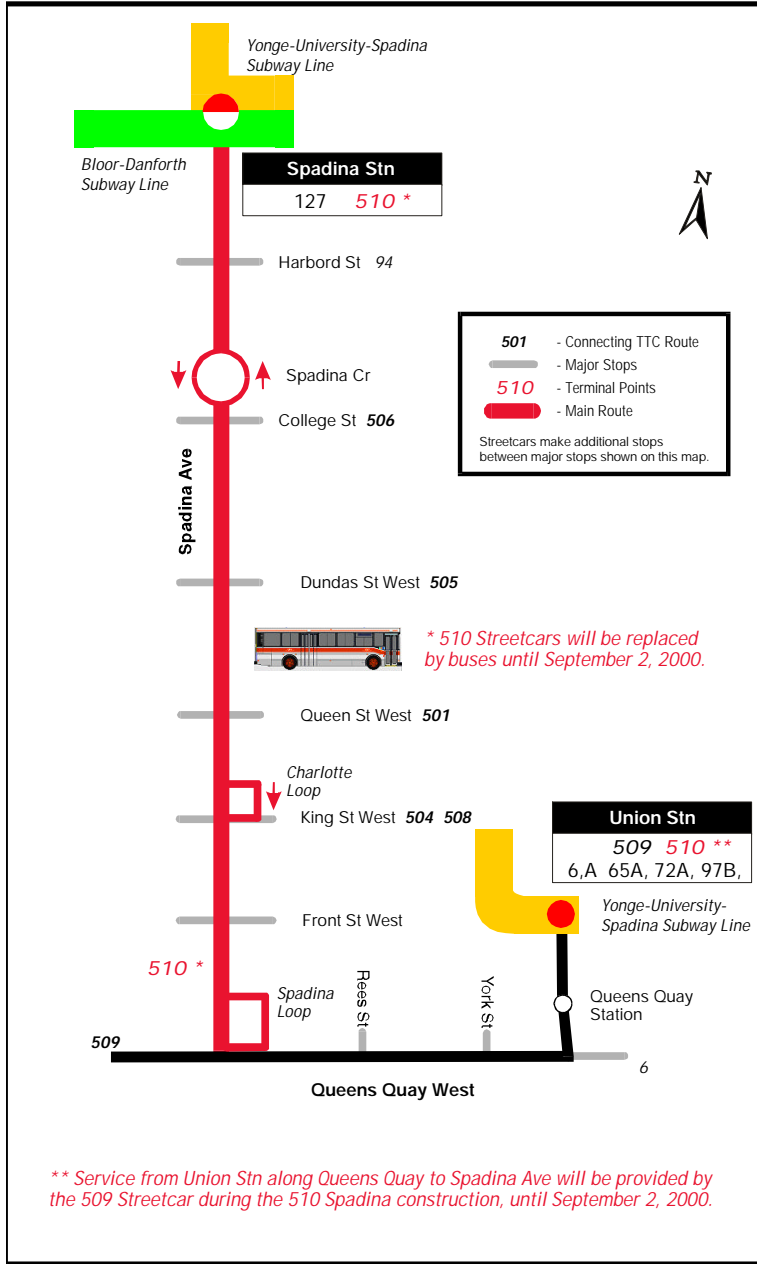

July 23, 2000 Service Changes

Temporary bus replacement along Spadina Ave (July 23 to September 2, 2000)

Streetcar service on Spadina Avenue will be replaced by buses operating in the regular traffic lanes between Spadina Station and Queens Quay to allow construction of permanent streetcar barriers on Spadina Avenue.

Service between Queens Quay and Union Station will be provided by the new 509 Harbourfront streetcar route.

From Monday to Friday during the afternoon peak period the route will be split, to reduce the effects of heavy traffic congestion, into north (Spadina Stn-King) and south (King-Queens Quay) sections:

- North - customers travelling north past King Street will transfer between buses at Spadina Avenue and King Street.
- South - customers travelling south past King Street will transfer between buses at Spadina Avenue and King Street.

Streetcar service may resume over part or all of the route before September 2.

Service Summary

- 510 - Spadina Stn ↔ Queens Quay & Spadina (Spadina Loop)
- 510 - Spadina Stn ↔ King
- 510 - King ↔ Queens Quay & Spadina (Spadina Loop)

Monday – Friday (5:15 a.m. - 2:15 a.m.)

- Service runs every 4 - 6 minutes during the day, and every 7 minutes during the late evening.

Saturday (5:15 a.m. - 2:15 a.m.)

- Service runs every 4 - 5 minutes during the day, and every 6 - 7 minutes during the late evening and early morning.

Sunday (5:20 a.m. - 2:15 a.m.)

- Service runs every 6 - 7 minutes during the day, and every 11 minutes during the early morning.

Request Stop Program

Allows women travelling alone on buses between 9:00 p.m. - 5:00 a.m. to ask the driver to let them get off the bus at locations between the regular TTC stops.

TTC's Blue Night Network

Service is provided from approximately 1:30 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. on a basic network of routes throughout Toronto, at stops with reflective blue bands. Service is provided every 30 minutes or better.
