

### Coxwell Station Improvements

#### Easier Access Improvements:

- Barrier free path to all levels of the station including installation of:
  - 2 elevators to access eastbound and westbound platforms
  - 2 accessible fare gates
  - 3 automatic sliding doors
  - Improved signage including wayfinding
  - CCTV Security cameras
  - Upgrade station power
- Reviewed by ACAT (Advisory Committee on Accessible Transit)



#### Coxwell Station Easier Access

#### Station Improvements


- Re-paving bus loop
- Enhanced lighting with new light standards in bus loop
- Replace fence around bus loop perimeter and walkway
- New landscape design adjacent to the bus loop
- Improvements to walkway between Danforth and Strathmore

Easier Access and Station Improvements are combined into one project to reduce disruption

Coxwell Station is scheduled to be accessible in 2017







#### Coxwell Station Public Art

- Station upgrade work is subject to TTC Public Art Policy
- Art will be an important component of the station improvements
- Art jury including a local representative will review proposals
- One artist selected to produce artwork
- Concept presented to community at open house
- TTC Board approves concept
- Artist develops the artwork in co-ordination with the Easier Access Project

Having reviewed three excellent public art proposals for the Coxwell TTC station, the jury unanimously selected "Forwards and Backwards" by Jennifer Davis & Jon Sasaki. 
### Public Art Concept




### Proposed Landscape Plan






# No direct bus access into Coxwell Station during construction of elevator 1 and bus roadway






### Traffic Management – Stage 1

### Project Schedule

July - September - complete Elevator E2, below grade

- complete elevator shaft

Fall 2015 - restore properties at 350 and 352 Strathmore Blvd including landscaping

and porches

- temporarily relocate high voltage lines from south side of Strathmore to

north side

- restore location of hydro poles on the north side of Strathmore Blvd.

- close bus loop

- construct Elevator E1 - caisson, grouting and excavation

- repave bus roadway

2017 - complete elevator cab and system installation

- complete bus roadway

- elevators in service

- install perimeter fence

- restore green space and install bike racks - south side of Strathmore Blvd.
